Slow Zones: Neighborhood traffic calming. NPOs, community groups, others can apply

Weekend Walks: Recurring street closure. NPOs, community groups, others can apply





Street Seats: seasonal platform in curb lane. Any adjacent business/organization can apply DOT Art: Partnership between community groups and artists jointly apply



City Bench: Nonprofits, property owners, residents can apply
