








Leadership New York

LNY challenges mid-career professionals from across non-profit, public and private sectors to explore critical issues facing New York City and develop new ways to lead change in their communities and organizations.

LNY: Who Should Apply?



Applicants should be prepared for an immersive, groupstructured experience in personal reflection for leadership growth and public policy exploration.

Candidate requirements:

- Live or work in New York City
- At least 7 years of professional work experience
- Must be employed at the time of application
- Passion for developing new leadership skills germane to problem-solving in New York
- Demonstrated interest in civic engagement



Immigrant Civic Leadership Program

ICLP is an exciting leadership development program for leaders who are working to create transformative change in immigrant communities in New York City.

ICLP: Who Should Apply?



Organizational leaders and emerging changemakers whose work is focused on strengthening NYC immigrant communities

Candidate requirements:

- Work in New York City for an organization supporting immigrant communities
- At least 5 years of work experience relevant to work with immigrant communities
- Passion for developing new leadership skills essential to problemsolving in New York
- A defined Community Change Project that seeks to strengthen immigrant communities
- Interest in actively participating in the Coro community and ICLP alumni network



Neighborhood Leadership

NL provides leaders of community-based development organizations with the knowledge and skills to improve leadership abilities and organizational management practices.

NL: Who Should Apply?



Nonprofit management professionals who are leading commercial revitalization efforts in their communities—for example, working in a Business Improvement District, Merchant Association, local development corporation, or Chamber of Commerce, etc.

Candidate requirements:

- Work in NYC for a nonprofit organization whose work is focused on commercial revitalization.
- Experienced management staffer who is leading change on behalf of his or her organization around commercial revitalization.
- Passion for developing new leadership skills germane to problemsolving in NYC.
- Interest in joining the Coro community and NL alumni network
